# Block 5




# What you need for the stitchery block:

6" square of your choice of background fabric.

Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the pattern onto the piece of background fabric, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.

Stitches used are backstitch and French/Colonial knots.



This quilt lends itself perfectly to scraps!

I decided that I would not use any of the same fabrics twice, so in each block I have used a different fabric for the square-in-a-square triangles, and the triangles for the flying geese.

While I could have used my scraps, I decided to break open a fat quarter pack that I had on my shelf.

So in the end I used a little bit from 16 fat quarters. This is the bundle I used:

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### Materials needed for the Say It With Flowers BOM:

1 yard of background fabric

16 different types of scraps less than a fat 1/8th needed

Fat 1/8th scrap for corner stones

1/4 yard for sashing

1 1/2 yards for borders


#### Materials needed for each block:


Background fabric

Scrap #1

# **Block Assembly**





#### PRESS:

Turn your stitchery around and press from the back till it is nice and smooth.

#### TRIM:

Trim your stitchery down to 4 3/4" square.

Don't stress too much if it isn't exactly centered in the square. This is all handmade and perfection is not the goal!

This is the "D" block in the diagram above.

### Make the Center Square in a Square Block


#### Cut:

Using scraps #1:


- cut two 3 3/4" squares, then
- cut both squares in half on the diagonal to make 4 triangles total

#### SEW:

Sew one triangle on either side of the 4 3/4" stitchery block D.



Press away from the center block, then sew the remaining triangles on the other sides of the stitchery block D.



#### Make the Flying Geese Units

#### Cut:

Four 3  $1/2" \times 6 1/2"$  rectangles of background fabric (B units)


Eight 3 1/2" squares of scraps #2

#### DRAW:


Draw a diagonal line on the back of each of the 3 1/2" squares.

#### SEW:


Place a square right sides together on one side of the rectangle B:




Sew ON the line, then trim a quarter inch away:



Press away from the rectangle:




Place another square right sides together on the other side of the rectangle B:




# SEW:

Sew ON the line, then trim a quarter inch away:



Press away from the rectangle:



Make FOUR of these flying geese units

#### Assemble the Block:



Four 3 1/2" squares of background fabric (these are the A squares below)


# SEW:
